Preference will be given to specifically theological engagement with the topic—systematic, political, liberation, feminist, liturgical, ethical, pastoral, biblical, patristic etc. Presenters will be given a 30 minute slot, 20 minutes for the paper and 10 minutes for discussion.

- What possibilities does the pandemic create for people of faith?
- What voice can theologians find to speak to a secular audience in relation to the pandemic?
